Copying as a way of learning art has been practiced throughout history. United Art & Education features how to practice this technique using Graftix Clear-Lay Film.

## Supplies:

Graftix Clear-Lay Film  
Ultra-Fine Black Sharpie  
Pictures of famous paintings  
Printer/Photocopier  
Tape  
White Paper  
Markers, Colored Pencils, Oil Pastels or Crayons

## Directions:

1. Start by printing a color copy of a famous painting on a sheet of 8.5 x 11" paper. Tape a sheet of 8.5 x 11" Graftix Clear-Lay film on top of the image.
2. Using an ultra-fine Sharpie marker and trace the important elements of the painting. Your tracing doesn't have to be exact; it can be your own interpretation of the painting.
3. Photocopy the finished tracing onto white paper.
4. Explore the original artist's style, use of color and brush strokes. Color you're tracing with crayons, markers, colored pencils, oil pastels or any medium you wish.
