Craft Plastic Tags

Learn how to make this Craft Plastic Tag using Grafix Clear Craft Plastic, Doubletack Mounting Film, and Chipboard!

Supplies:

Grafix Craft Plastic Crystal Clear 12" x 12" Grafix Doubletack Mounting Film 9"x12" Grafix Black Chipboard

LPC060 & Words 2 I&TD Stamp set
(PaperArtsy)
Glossy Accents (Ranger)
Distress Oxide Reinkers in Spun Sugar,
Peacock Feathers & Mowed Lawn (Ranger)
White gel pen (Sakura)
Green & Gold microbeads
Black Stazon Ink (Tsukineko) White ink
White tissue paper
Metal Eyelet
Pink Fibres

Directions:

- 1. Using the Craft Plastic and the long stamp, stamp onto the plastic using Stazon ink. Crumple the tissue paper and carefully smooth out leaving wrinkles remaining.
- 2. Using Glossy Accents, draw a wider rectangle around the reverse of the image and cover the area with a layer of Glossy Accents.
- 3. Using the Oxide reinkers, add small dots on the Glossy Accent layer, gently spreading it around with a toothpick or similar.
- 4. Once you've got enough of the colour spread, sprinkle on microbeads and carefully lay the tissue over the top, gently pressing it into the wet mixture.
- 5. Leave the whole piece to dry.
- 6. Trim the piece down so all edges are sealed. Using Double Tack, trim out a piece a similar size and use it to adhere to a chipboard tag that you've cut out.
- 7. Stamp using white ink onto the bottom left and top right corner. Add some Glossy Accents onto the numbers and sprinkle more microbeads onto it. Leave to dry.
- 8. Finish the tag with an eyelet, fibres, run a gold pen around the edges and add some faux stitching using a gel pen.



Tips:

- 1. Chipboard is easy to cut with a craft knife. Score the line first and then cut a few times to get a clean cut.
- 2. This technique is ideal with dye ink reinkers but make sure if using the Oxides that you seal the back with more Glossy Accents, glue or Doubletack.
- 3. Leave the Glossy Accents to dry overnight to ensure everything is dry.
